POINTS

Points	Vote or Decision?	Objection	Majority required	Pro/ Con	Purpose
Point of Personal Privilege	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	A delegate can address personal discomfort that hinders their ability to participate in the committee.
Right of Reply	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	If a delegate feels their personal or states integrity infringed, the delegate must quote the infringing statement.
Point of Information	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	If a delegate has a substantive question during formal debate.
Point of Parliamentary enquiry	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	If a delegate has a question regarding the procedure or Rules of Procedure.
Point of Order	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	If a delegate believes that there was a mistake regarding the Rules of Procedure.

Motions	Vote or Decision?	Objection	Majority required	Pro/ Con	Purpose
Motion for a roll call vote	Decision (Dais)	no	-	-	If the result of a previous voting was not clear
Motion to appeal the Dais' decision	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	-	The Dais must explain their decision before the voting
Motion for an unmoderated caucus	Vote	yes	Simple majority	-	The length of the unmoderated caucus must be stated by the delegate.
Motion to adopt the agenda	Vote	yes	Simple majority	1 pro 1 con	The order of the agenda can be changed before the debate on a topic starts
Motion to add an item to the agenda	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	2 pro 2 con	This motion adds a new topic on the agenda. The new topic is to be set on the agenda immediately after the current topic. This motion is not in order in the Human Rights Council (Menschenrechtsrat).
Motion to end the current debate	Vote	yes	Simple majority	-	The current debate or moderated caucus ends immediately and the committee proceeds with the voting procedure or the superior debate.

Motions	Vote or Decision?	Objection	Majority required	Pro/ Con	Purpose
Motion to adjourn the debate	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	1 pro 1 con	The committee immediately ends the current debate on the topic and moves on to the next topic on the agenda
Motion to return to the general Speaker's list on the current topic	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	-	If this motion is accepted all draft resolutions expire and the General Speaker's List will be reopened. Working papers have to be introduced again to be recognized.
Motion for immediate vote on the draft resolution as a whole	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	1 pro 1 con	The motion is directly followed by the vote to adopt the draft resolution as a whole.
Motion to present the draft resolutions	Vote	yes	2/3rd majority	2 pro 2 con	This motion is followed by the presentation of the three draft resolutions with the most signatories. Working papers can only be formally introduced to the floor as draft resolutions after the presentation.
Motion to introduce a draft resolution	Vote	yes	Simple Majority	-	The draft resolution must be available to all delegates before the voting on this motion takes place.

Motions	Vote or Decision?	Objection	Majority required	Pro/ Con	Purpose
Motion to introduce an unfriendly amendment	Vote	Yes	Simple majority	1 pro 1con	This motion is only in order when the amendment was handed in to the Dais before, the length of the moderated caucus must be stated by the delegate, a maximum of 10 minutes applies. A pro and con speaker is permitted.
Motion for a moderated caucus	Vote	Yes	Simple majority	-	The topic and the length of the moderated caucus must be stated by the delegate. During a moderated caucus questions and short statements are in order.
Motion for closure or reopening the speakers list	Vote	Yes	Simple majority	-	The motion can either refer to the speakers list itself or the list for questions and short statements.
Motion to adjust the speaking time	Vote	Yes	Simple majority	-	The motion can refer to speeches or questions and short statements (30 seconds maximum).
Motion to invite a representative or guest speaker	Vote	Yes	Simple majority	-	The speech must relate to the current topic. The secretariat finally decides upon the adoption of this motion.
